## WORKING FOR THE WEEKEND

Under Australia's working holiday program, if you are aged between 18 and 31 you may apply for a one-year Australian working holiday visa. A working visa allows you to supplement your travel funds through any kind of work of a temporary or casual nature (although you can't stay with any one employer for more than six months).

If after 12 months you find you don't want to go home, there is also a second-year working holiday visa available. To obtain this second visa, you must prove you have worked in an area designated by the Australian government as "regional", and that three months of that work has been in a special field or industry. The whole state of South Australia is classified as regional, so as long as you choose the right jobs during your stay you should be eligible for the second visa.

South Australia offers many of the jobs within the occupations and industries that fit the "special field" criteria - in plant or animal cultivation, mining, construction, fishing and pearling, and tree farming. If you satisfy the requirements you can apply for the second-year visa from within or outside Australia.
